### Instructional Focus:

**Listening** – Students listen for a variety of purposes appropriate to the grade level.

**Speaking** – Students speak for a variety of purposes and audiences with sophistication and complexity appropriate to the grade level.

### Performance Task

Students must be able to relate to their parents. This lesson will look at conflicts and possible resolutions.

1. Explain to the students that today you will be looking at some times they have gotten into trouble.
2. Distribute drawing paper. Give three sheets to each student.
3. Ask them to draw pictures of times they got into trouble with their parents.
4. Ask students to share their pictures and tell what happened. Ask them why it happened. “How did you feel when it happened?” “Could anyone have acted differently?”
5. Explain to the students that parents discipline their children because they love them and want them to be safe. Parents don’t discipline just to be mean.
