Instructional Focus:

Writing – Students write for a variety of purposes and audiences with sophistication and complexity appropriate to the grade level.

Listening – Students listen for a variety of purposes appropriate to the grade level.

Speaking – Students speak for a variety of purposes and audiences with sophistication and complexity appropriate to the grade level.

Reading - Students read a variety of grade level materials, applying strategies appropriate to various situations.

Performance Task

This lesson provides students with experience in technical writing and reading.

1. Tell the students that today they are going to teach others to make peanut butter and jelly sandwiches.
2. Ask students to write step-by-step directions on how to make the sandwiches.
3. Provide the ingredients to make the sandwiches.
4. Have students exchange instructions with their classmates and following the written instructions, make the sandwiches.
5. Ask the students to share their experiences and observations. Were they able to assemble the sandwiches from the directions provided?
