Instructional Focus:

Listening – Students listen for a variety of purposes appropriate to the grade level.

Speaking – Students speak for a variety of purposes and audiences with sophistication and complexity appropriate to the grade level.

Performance Task

This activity will assist students in identifying the different jobs in a school and understanding the important roles all school workers, as well as students play.

1. Begin the class by asking students “What is a school?” Follow this by asking the following questions: What is the name of our school? In what neighborhood is our school? Who works in our school?
2. Explain to the students that a school is like a small neighborhood with people who depend on each other to make it work. Identify as many jobs in a school as possible and list on the chalkboard. Examples: principal, teacher, vice principal, cafeteria workers, janitors, bus drivers, security guards, students, etc.
3. Discuss with the students the different work tasks for each worker in the school and what would happen if one of them didn’t come to work. Example: What would happen if the teacher didn’t come to work?
4. Explain and demonstrate to the students what a job web is. (A job web is similar to an organization chart. It is a diagram that shows relationships of jobs in an organization in a web like fashion.) Ask them to work in groups of two to draw a job web for their school.
