Instructional Focus:

Listening – Students listen for a variety of purposes appropriate to the grade level.

Speaking – Students speak for a variety of purposes and audiences with sophistication and complexity appropriate to the grade level.

Performance Task

1. Show students pictures of people doing work activities. Ask them to describe what the people in the pictures are doing.
2. Ask them if the pictures show people at work. Ask them to state reasons for their answers.
3. Ask students to list work activities that people do at home, i.e., wash dishes, laundry, fix cars, mow lawn, and analyze if that is “work” or not and why it is or is not “work”.
4. As a class activity, come up with a list of questions that students will ask their family members, business people, or neighbors about the type of work they do.
5. Ask students to interview two people using these questions. Have them report back to the class during the next session.
