Instructional Focus:

Reading

Students read a variety of grade level materials, applying strategies appropriate to various situations

Writing

Students write for a variety of purposes and audiences with sophistication and complexity appropriate to the grade level.

Performance Task

At the end of a novel, whether assigned for outside reading or classroom instruction, students will be able to develop their own web pages that summarize the action in the story and provide a recommendation of the book. Teachers can use journal or response activities while students are reading to periodically check for progress.

It is appropriate to use the writing process to develop the web pages. Students may not be allowed to add backgrounds or animated gifs until their web page is free of errors and misspellings.

Schools must have Internet access, and students must have access to a web design program such as Netscape Navigator, Microsoft Front Page, or Macromedia's Dreamweaver.
