Instructional Focus:

Writing - Students write for a variety of purposes and audiences with sophistication and complexity appropriate to the grade level.

Performance Task

Write an imaginative story called “Rocky’s Invention”. Think of an unusual idea for either a realistic or imaginary invention. Then determine whether this invention causes or solves a problem in a story with a character named Rocky, who may be any kind of character you choose (for example boy, girl, animal character, imaginary creature...). The story must have a beginning with a description of setting and character(s), middle with a clear problem and an attempt to solve the problem, and an ending with a solution to the problem and details about how the characters feel.

Use the writing process to brainstorm ideas, write a first draft, share a first draft with a peer and edit and revise using the criteria in the scoring guide. Finally, submit a final draft for evaluation.
